THIS MONTH'S PROGRAM

We had a change in the April program from what is in the directory. Gellert Modos is very ill and cannot make it up to Wheaton this year. So, **thankfully**, Reginald Gerig is filling in for us.

The topic is "What History has to say about Developing a Natural Piano Technique.", based on material in his book. He will refer to the panel discussion, chaired by Barbara Lister-Sink at the MTNA session in Denver on March 30.

Reginald Gerig graduated from the Juilliard School in New York City in 1948 and 1949 with BS and MS degrees in piano. While at Juilliard, he studied piano with Sascha Gorodnitzki, Carl Friedburg, and Joseph Raieff and piano literature with Irwin Freundlich. Previous to 3 ½ years of military service in World War II, he had received the BM degree from Wheaton College in 1942. He was a member of the piano faculty of the Eastman School of Music from 1950 to 1952 before returning to Wheaton. He taught piano and related subjects there for 35 years (14 as chair of the piano department) before retiring as Professor of Piano Emeritus in 1987. He was also organist at College Church in Wheaton from 1953 to 1991. He was membership secretary of the American Liszt Society from 1983 to 1991. For many years, Gerig has had an interest in what pianists from the past have had to say about their approach to their keyboard instruments. His definitive volume, "Famous Pianists & Their Technique", issued in 1974 by Robert B. Luce, Inc., and has become a widely used and acclaimed history of piano technical thought. Indiana University Press, Bloomington, republished a new edition, with appendices, in 2007. Over the years, he has traveled throughout the United States and England lecturing on the subject. In 1984, he was named Alumnus of the Year by the Wheaton College Alumni Association for Distinguished Service to Alma Mater.

UPCOMING RECITAL

Our member **John Zimmerman, Associate Professor of Music at Wheaton College Conservatory**, is presenting a recital, "Piano Through the Years," on **Monday, March 31 at 8:00 PM in Pierce Chapel**. The program includes pieces of widely varying levels of difficulty by many composers, beginning with John Thompson's "Teaching Little Fingers to Play" and proceeding to Bach's Prelude and Fugue in C Major (WTC I) and Two-Part Invention No. 8, sonata movements by Haydn, Mozart, Clementi and Beethoven, several Chopin etudes, Ravel's Jeux d'eau, Liszt Consolation No. 1, Gershwin Prelude No. 1, a Chinese piece, Clair de Lune, and pieces by Brahms, Schumann, et cetera.
