### **FIVE FREE BAND CONCERTS**

The 12th annual Wheaton Band Festival is scheduled for the evenings of July 15 and 16 in Memorial Park (W. Seminary and N. Hale) in downtown Wheaton. Five different types of bands will participate: brass, jazz, concert, steel drum and military.

On Friday the Chicago Brass Band and the Switch Time Jazz Ensemble will play starting at 7:15 p.m. The Fox Valley Concert Band, the Salvation Story Steel Orchestra and the Navy Ceremonial Band Great Lakes will perform beginning at 6 p.m. on Saturday. Carl Grapentine of WFMT-FM (98.7) returns as festival announcer. All the concerts are free.

The Salvation Story Steel Orchestra is comprised of 20 young people from Chicago's Englewood neighborhood. This spirited steel drum ensemble with flag team specializes in Calypso music from the West Indies. Salvation Army Captain Julian Champion founded the group as part of his vision to transform the lives of inner-city youth.

The Navy Band Great Lakes celebrates its 100th anniversary this year as the "Navy's Ambassadors to the Midwest." Lt. John Philip Sousa served as the band's director starting in 1917.

## Berkley-Pendell Piano Competition Update

After five years of dedicated service, Berkley-Pendell Piano Competition chair Deb Bridenbaugh of our Waubensee chapter has announced her resignation. The Joint Board of the four West Suburban ISMTA chapters met in late May to discuss the future of the piano competition.

The Berkley-Pendell Fund, named after the two founding members of West Suburban ISMTA, was established in 1986. Its purpose is to provide ongoing financial support for the Berkley-Pendell Piano Competition (formerly known as the Scholarship Competition.) Money is raised each year from entrance fees for the competition and contributions from the four joint West Suburban chapters (Naperville, Salt Creek, Waubensee, and West Suburban.)

Due to a dramatic decrease in enrollment this year, as well as having no chair to take it over, the Joint Board has decided to suspend the competition for 2012. In the meantime, a Review Committee will be appointed to evaluate the competition's current state of affairs, seek feedback from ISMTA members, and investigate how to best reinvent the competition in order to serve the needs of our members better.

The competition is open to students through grade 12 who study with ISMTA members who earn enough points through attending meetings and workshops, serving on the board, and in other ways. Students come from all our member chapters most years. In the past five years, there have been anywhere from 11 to 18 teachers participating, and from 22 to 62 students. The lowest numbers were this year, and the highest last year. (The total number of teachers in the four groups is somewhere around 300.)

Many reasons have been cited as to why enrollment is down. The award money could be seen as insufficient incentive for students to enter, given the high level of the other competitors. The current enrollment fee is \$25, and the prize money ranges from \$75 to \$175, with 10 possible prizes totaling \$1075. However, fewer prizes were awarded this year due to the low enrollment—6 prizes totaling \$700.

There is also a perception that the class of students entering is particularly competitive, playing very difficult repertoire in all divisions. Teachers of students with less intense drive may not encourage their students to enter, feeling that they have no chance of winning a prize.
