March Meeting & Program – March 4, 9:30am

Dr. Steve Pierson, 'We Sang Ourselves Free – Development (Educational Influence) and Uses of Music Among Estonian Christians from Repression to Independence'




With its unusually large national song festivals, the small Baltic state of Estonia has often been called "The Singing Nation." In this presentation, the available history of Estonia's singing culture will be examined along with its educational function in society. In addition, more recent academic publications focusing on music participation and overall academic development will be presented.

A native of Illinois, Steven J. Pierson, graduated with a Bachelor's and Master's in Music Education from the University of Illinois. While at U of I, Decca Recording Company engaged Pierson on a part time basis. This allowed him to participate in several award-winning recordings of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra with conductor Sir Georg Solti, pianist Vladimir Ashkenazy and mezzo soprano Marilyn Horne. Possessing academic level fluency in Swedish, he later served for 15 years as an instructor, dean of students and academic dean of a small post-secondary school in west central Sweden. During this time, Pierson became acquainted with the music of Eastern Europe, particularly the Baltic States. With the relaxed policies of the latter Soviet Union, students from Latvia and Estonia were accepted to the school, further deepening Pierson's interest. During his Ph.D. studies in international education, Pierson's supervising professor, Dr. Ted Ward, worked together with him on plans to research Estonian choir music and its relationship to their cultural identity, history and general education. Articles based on this research have been published by Pierson in Estonian, Finnish, Swedish and English. Pierson currently teaches part time at the College of Dupage and is a member of horn section of the DuPage Symphony Orchestra. His horn teachers included Ethel Merker of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and Bernhard Scully of the Canadian Brass. In addition, he has presented pre-concert lectures for The New Philharmonic Orchestra, resident at the College of DuPage.

'Learning Without Practicing' is a highly interactive workshop focusing on techniques for learning music without using an instrument. This session focuses on non-traditional score-study techniques mixing solo work with collaborative work, a rarity for the usually insular pianist. In addition to the active Mental Practice techniques, participants also have a chance to experience passive Mental Practice techniques through a specially customized approach to Meditation for Pianists.

In this workshop,12 active participants will interact and perform a short musical segment on a piano, publicly via Zoom (specific music settings for Zoom will be sent to all confirmed participants). An unlimited number of auditor participants will be accepted who will receive materials to do the exercises on their own, but not interactively or publicly. I personally have tried some of these and highly recommend you experience them both for to try yourself and help your students.

Frederic Chiu performs at major venues on five continents and collaborates with Classical music friends Joshua Bell, Pierre Amoyal and the St Lawrence String Quartet. Prof. Chiu was runner up at the Van Cliburn and studied at Indiana University as well as the Julliard School with major pedagogues including Dr. Karen Shaw, Abbey Simon, Aube Tzerko, Marvin Wolfthal and Marian Rybicki. Frederic Chiu has recorded the most extensive complete piano works of Prokofiev. Across 28 albums, he has also recorded works of Chopin, Liszt, Ravel, Mendelssohn, Brahms, Rossini and Grieg. He is on the faculty at Carnegie Mellon University and The Hartt School. He accepts a limited number of undergraduate and graduate students, who learn the lesson that Chiu himself has learned: Music is not an escape from life; it is a doorway into life.
