Our November 4th program, "S.O.S. How Can I Help My Students? Technical and Musical Problem-Solving in Commonly Taught Repertoire" will feature Stephanie Myers, our long-time member, who is now living in Texas. The business meeting starts at 9:30 followed by this program.

Stephanie will be sharing her ideas on how to avoid "likely problems" as well as solutions to those challenges in the following repertoire. Please bring your own scores to follow along.

- 1. March in D, Anh 122 by C.P.E. Bach (AIM, level 5-6)
- 2. Allegro in FM by Haydn (AIM Level 5-6)
- 3. Arabesque, Op.100, No. 2 by Burgmüller (AIM level 5-6)
- 4. Toccatina by Kabalevsky (AIM level 7)

Stephanie Nakahara Myers, NCTM holds B.A. from Calvin College, and Master of Music in Piano Pedagogy and Performance from Northwestern University School of Music, where she studied pedagogy with Elvina Pearce and Francis Larimer. She was previously director of Baldwin Music Education Center. She also served on the faculties of Northwestern University School of Music Piano Academy and College of DuPage. She has performed with the DuPage Symphony as a guest pianist for the performance of Petrushka. Having operated a thriving private studio in Wheaton for over thirty years, she and her husband recently relocated to



Fort Worth, Texas. She continues to teach her Wheaton students virtually. Mrs. Myers still holds membership in West Suburban ISMTA, where she served in many capacities, including AIM Theory Chair, AIM Performance Chair, Program Chair, Certificate Chair and Treasurer. She continues to serve as AIM Repertoire Approval Chair for the State AIM Committee. She has written several articles for the Clavier Companion Magazine (formally known as the "Keyboard Companion"). Mrs. Myers has given presentations for the local chapters of ISMTA, including a masterclass. She has been a sought-after judge/adjudicator for numerous festivals and competitions. She is currently enrolled in TMO (Teach Music Online) course and is excited to be learning more to improve her online teaching skills. Keyboard skills and playback (levels 3 - 6) portions of the exam will be given by the student's teacher.


