

September Meeting & Program - September 1, 9:30am

"The Happy Birthday Song as Bait - Strategies for Ear Training," Dr. Christina Tio

This presentation seeks to share strategies for training the ear, teaching hands-on theoretical concepts and developing an appreciation for basic improvisation. The presentation will zero in on how the strategies could be applied using the "Happy Birthday" song. The session will be packed with actionable ideas, along with excerpts of lesson videos where students at various playing levels are guided to listen, sing, and play the Happy Birthday song around the Circle of Fifths. Some student samples of creative renditions of the song will also be included to demonstrate possible impact of the strategies.

Christina Tio earned her piano performing and teaching diplomas, BA (Hons) and MMus in Piano Performance in the United Kingdom at Royal Birmingham Conservatoire and Reading University respectively. Her interest in musicology, and the award of a scholarship, led her into musicological research with Nicholas Cook, under whose guidance, she completed her PhD in Musicology at the University of Southampton, UK.

First began teaching the piano at age 14, Christina maintained a studio all through her school and college. Before moving to Chicago, she also taught for five years at various colleges and universities in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Dr. Tio has been a regular session presenter. Dr. Tio has also served as a Piano Masterclass clinician at the biennial Suzuki Association of the Americas (SAA) Teachers Conference in Minneapolis in 2018. She frequently adjudicates at festivals and competitions, and enjoys teaching and mentoring students, parents and fellow teachers at workshops and summer institutes around the US, as well as in Singapore.

Passionate about the Suzuki philosophy, Christina considers Parent Education and Developing Musicality her forte. She enjoys a thriving piano studio characterized by excellence and joy, where music making is appreciated as a lifelong endeavor. Her students frequently receive awards at local, regional, national and international competitions. They also perform extensively in the community at festivals and nursing homes to warm critical acclaim. Prize winnings have also led her students to appearances at SAA Biennial Conferences in Minneapolis, Alice Millar Chapel at Northwestern University, Carnegie Hall's Weill Hall and Merkin Hall in Kaufman Center in New York, Beethoven Haus in Bonn, Germany, as well as MTNA National Conference. Christina is currently a Suzuki Piano faculty at the Music Institute of Chicago. Aside from in-person lessons and group classes, Christina also teaches online with students in Kansas City, Colorado and California, in the UK and in Singapore. 

AIM Mentor Program

ATTENTION: Any teachers planning to enter students in AIM for the first time!

September 1 is the deadline for newly participating teachers to notify the AIM coordinators of their intent to enroll students in the Theory Exams (Level 3-12) and to contact the mentoring coordinator to arrange for a mentor. This will allow the AIM coordinators to ensure that the teacher's names are on the enrollment form and that the teachers have a mentor in a timely fashion. NOTE! THESE ARE NOT ENROLLMENT DEADLINES, BUT NOTIFICATION DEADLINES.

If you have not entered students in AIM before or in the past 10 years, please notify the following people: Mentoring Coordinator: Linda Krueger Theory Exam (3-12) Coordinators: Lynette Zelis and Carol Beilke

The Performance Exam notification deadline (Levels 1A-12) will be January 1. Performance Exam (1A-12)

The AIM Mentor Program is intended to encourage greater participation by teachers new to the program, guide them in the successful preparation of their students, and most importantly encourage the highest level of preparation and understanding for first time judging and scoring of the exams by each teacher.

West Suburban ISMTA Theory Exams, Fall 2022

Registration is due on September 15th.

The cost is \$30 per student - check accepted only, made out to WSMTA.

The exams will take place on October 15th - at Wheaton College Conservatory, Armerding hall.

For all AIM participating teachers - it's required to judge or help in the office for a minimum of 4 hours. This amount increases with the amount of students you are entering. If you are new to AIM and entering students for the first time, you need to contact Linda Krueger, lkruegermusicstudio@gmail.com, to have a mentor assigned to you.

Please let me know what topics you'd like to cover at our AIM meeting on October 6. **This is a required judge's session for all teachers entering students in the October AIM theory exams.** One change from last year - judges will be administering the aural skills - no ipods. This is due to a few factors we will discuss at the meeting in October. Are there areas of AIM theory you'd like to discuss or judging questions you have in mind? I'd be happy to address them. Or email me with ideas or topics for this session by September 1.

Our policy at will be as follows for your out of state students:

These students will pay the usual AiM fee, plus the \$25 fee for the makeup judges for both Theory and Performance exams. These exams will be in real time and judged online. Students must make arrangements with a Judge willing to give the exams on Zoom or facetime. The Judge has to be a member of our Chapter. The written portion will be emailed to the students prior to the playing portion of the exam, then the



student must send the completed work directly to the judge for grading along with the aural portion. The administering of the written portion will be completed and monitored by the parents of the student. Sight reading and harmonizations will need to be emailed to the student the day of the exam and not visible to the student until the exam is given.

From the Editor


