

West Suburban ISMTA Theory Exams, Fall 2022

The exams will take place on October 15th - at Wheaton College Conservatory, Armerding Hall.



For all participating AIM teachers - it's required to judge or help in the office a minimum of 4 hours. This amount increases with the amount of students you are entering.

The cost is \$30 per student - check accepted only, made out to WSMTA. (one check per teacher for all students). Payment can be:

- . mailed to Lynette Zelis
- . dropped off in the mailbox at Noteable Notes 406 S. Main St. Wheaton
- . or brought to the meeting on Oct. 6.

The October 6th meeting is a required judges session for all teachers entering students in the October AIM theory exams. One change from last year - judges will be administrating the aural skills- no ipods. This is due to a few factors we will discuss at the meeting in October. Lynette Zelis and Carol Beilke will present practice test portions of levels 3. 6 and 10.

AIM make-up exams are due by October 29.

Our policy will be as follows for out of state students:

These students will pay the usual AIM fee, plus the \$25 fee for the makeup judges for both Theory and Performance exams. These exams will be in real time and judged online. Students must make arrangements with a judge willing to give the exams on zoom or facetime. The judge has to be a member of our Chapter. The written portion will be emailed to the student prior to the playing portion of the exam, then the student must send the completed work directly to the judge for grading along with the aural portion. The administering of the written portion will be completed and monitored by the parents of the student. Sight reading and harmonizations will need to be emailed to the student the day of the exam and not visible to the student until the exam is given.
