May Meeting & Program – May 4, 9:30am

'Rhythm and Meter in the Keyboard Music of J.S. Bach,' Kate Boyd

As interpreters, we learn to approach the page with a "literal" mindset - carefully studying the score in order to honor the exact wishes of the composer. But what if the composer expected us to possess a knowledge of style, with the understanding that everything on the printed page is not precisely what we should play?



This session explores ways pianists might approach the question of rhythm and meter in the keyboard music of J.S. Bach. Using contemporary and historical sources, I will show possibilities for interpreting rhythm that differ from the printed page, and give suggestions on how we can use meter to understand tempo and rhythm.

Kate Boyd has performed solo recitals at New York's Carnegie Hall, Schubert's birth house in Vienna, the National Concert Hall in Dublin, the Musikhalle Hamburg, in addition to many other venues. Concerts and conferences have taken her to Germany, New Zealand, England, Canada, Malaysia, Greece, Florida, Texas, California, Idaho, Minnesota, Ohio, Illinois, Wisconsin, New York, and Michigan, among other places.

She has recorded two solo CDs. John Cage's Sonatas and Interludes for prepared piano was met with critical acclaim and has received more than 100,000 digital streams and downloads and streams to date. Her other CD, Music for the End of Winter, consists of previously-unrecorded works for solo piano by five American composers.

A versatile musician who is at home performing music from the 17th century to the present, Boyd regularly collaborates with other musicians and artists. She was a founding member of the Oracle Trio, a New York-based piano trio that performed throughout the US for ten years.

Dr. Boyd is also a well-regarded educator; she received the 2019 Teacher of the Year award from the Indiana Music Teachers Association and the 2017 Outstanding Professor of the Year award from Butler University. She was also a featured presenter at the 2018 MTNA Collegiate Symposium. In October, 2021 she created an educational YouTube channel (called "ThePianoProf"), geared toward developing pianists, which has more than 1500 subscribers to date.

Boyd is also active as a conference clinician. She has presented lectures and workshops at state, regional, national and international conferences, including the upcoming 2023 MTNA National Conference in Reno; the International John Cage Conference in Malaysia; the European Piano Teachers Association Conference in Germany; the College Music Society Great Lakes Regional Conference; and various state conferences. She is in high demand as an adjudicator; events she has judged include the MTNA Southern Division Competitions, the ISSMA state competition, and Stickley Piano Competition. For three years, Boyd also served on the national Fulbright screening committee for piano applicants. She regularly gives masterclasses to students through teacher organizations and universities, and she has worked with students of all ages.

Kate Boyd serves as Professor of Piano at Butler University. In the summers, she taught for 11 years at the internationally-renowned Interlochen Arts Camp in northern Michigan. She holds degrees from Stony Brook University, Oberlin Conservatory, and the Hannover (Germany) Academy of Music. Her major teachers were Gilbert Kalish, Arbo Valdma, and Arie Vardi.


