"Listening through Soundtracks," Ruth Mudge

For many students and adults, soundtracks are the gateway to listening and paying attention to classical music whether it is learning about motifs to learning to recognize orchestral instruments. Through this presentation, we will look at the various ways that music can help aid in telling a story through movies such as Pride and Prejudice, Harry Potter, Star Wars, and

We will also explore how encouraging students to listen and play soundtracks can be very valuable for a student's musical growth as well as the practical challenges that is faced by the student's ability or music available. Above all, it is about having fun with stories and learning to see the craftsmanship that goes into creating a story with music.

Ruth Mudge, a former native of Connecticut, is a cello instructor and performer in the Western Suburbs of the Chicago area. Ruth is a current faculty member of the String Academy of Chicago on both cello and piano. She received her Bachelors in Music Performance at Wheaton College and her Masters in Music Performance at DePaul University.

In addition to teaching students in the Wheaton, Glen Ellyn, and Naperville areas, Ruth is the Assistant Principal Cellist of the Elmhurst Symphony. She has performed around the area in concerts and gigs ranging from weddings to retirement homes to home concerts. She loves to share both classical music as well as participating in a worship music band at her local church. Besides performing and teaching, Ruth loves to explore other ways of sharing music from arranging to writing original songs to speaking about Soundtracks.

Ruth began teaching Soundtrack classes on Zoom in 2020 ranging from Star Wars to Harry Potter to Jane Austen adaptations. She presented a break-out session "The World of Jane Austen Soundtracks" at JASNA's AGM (Jane Austen Society of North America's Annual General Meeting) in 2021 as well as to local JASNA chapters around the country. Ruth is also the host of the podcast "World of Soundtracks" that debuted March 2022.



We want to thank everyone who contributed to make the AIM Theory Exams a success! Everything went smoothly on Saturday!




Students who need to complete a makeup exam should have already scheduled their exam with a judge. Makeup exams must be completed by October 28th. Makeup exam procedures and a list of

From the Editor


