
# "The Piano Music of Charles Griffes," Dr. Michael Fritsch

On Thursday, Dec. 7, Dr. Michael Fritsch will present a program on the piano works of Charles Griffes, modern American composer, for the West Suburban Music Teachers Association. The presentation will include brief biographical information, but will concentrate more on the repertoire, with a significant amount of performance of the pieces to illustrate the composer's style.

**Michael Fritsch** holds degrees in piano performance from Wheaton College, the University of Cincinnati, and Northwestern University, from which he received the Doctor of Music degree, studying with Donald Isaak. At Northwestern he also did extensive work in piano pedagogy with Frances Larimer. He was also elected to the music honor society, Pi Kappa Lambda. Dr. Fritsch has taught private piano at Wheaton College and private and class piano at the College of DuPage. He currently maintains an independent studio in Glen Ellyn. A lifelong church musician, he is currently organist at Kingswood United Methodist Church. Dr. Fritsch has had an interest in a wide variety of American music since undergraduate days. He is particularly interested in 20th-Century American composers, especially Norman Dello Joio, Roy Harris, Aaron Copland, and Charles Griffes, and recently presented seminars on their piano works to his adult students. Dr. Fritsch lives in Warrenville with his wife Janis, and four-legged child Andy, a border collie, who keeps them both hopping.
