March Meeting & Program – March 7, 9:00am

"Celebrating Rachmaninoff," Karin and Mark Edwards

Karin & Mark Edwards (Redekopp & Edwards) will present "Celebrating Rachmaninoff (1873-1943)" on Thursday, March 7, 2024. In 2023 the duo marked the 150th anniversary of Rachmaninoff's birth and the 80th of his death by performing several concerts in the Chicago area. As a follow up, this session will focus on different aspects of performing and teaching Rachmaninoff, aspects which can be applied to music of any level and other composers. Pieces to be performed and discussed include the Prelude in G Minor, Op. 23, No. 5, Prelude in G Major, Op. 32, No. 5, Polichinelle, and Etude-tableau in E-flat Minor, Op. 39, No. 5. You are invited to bring scores of these to the session.

In recent seasons duo-pianists Redekopp & Edwards have performed at the national American Liszt Society Festival at Northwestern University, the Mendelssohn Performing Arts Center in Rockford Main Stage Concert Series, the Indiana University Liszt Mini-Fest, and made their radio broadcast debut on "Live from WFMT Chicago: the Fazioli Salon Series." They have performed a concert for the Music Institute of Chicago in Evanston Winter Duo-Piano Festival, and at the University of Chicago, Washington University in St. Louis, Ohio University, Kings University in Edmonton, Alberta and numerous other colleges and universities in the USA and Canada. They have also released two CDs of duo-piano music.

In addition to a three-week tour of Japan and South Korea and performances in England, their concerts have included guest appearances with the Kenosha Symphony, the DuPage Symphony, the Bel Canto Chorus, the West Suburban Choral Union and Orchestra, and the Sullivan Chamber Ensemble. They have also performed concerts on the Valley Concert Society Artist Series in Abbotsford, British Columbia, the Green Lake Festival at Lawrence University, the Paine Art Center and Arboretum Concert Series in Oshkosh, the Evenings at the Bernsen Concert Series in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and other concert series.

Mark Edwards is the organist, pianist, and harpsichordist at Baker Memorial United Methodist Church in St. Charles IL. Karin Redekopp Edwards is professor emerita of piano at Wheaton College. In 2013 Wheaton College honored her with the prestigious Senior Scholar Achievement Award for her excellence in performing and teaching. Recognized as accomplished soloists, each has performed with orchestra, in recital and in chamber music concerts. Mark Edwards is a graduate of Eastman School of Music, studying with Cecile Genhart, and Indiana University. Karin Redekopp Edwards completed her studies at the University of Manitoba (BMus) and Indiana University (MM and DM degrees). The husband-and-wife team met while studying with Abbey Simon at Indiana University.

Musical Success for Students with Disabilities

The presentation will begin with basic terminology regarding teaching students with disabilities in the piano studio. The purpose of the presentation is to discuss adjudication and recital preparation of persons with disabilities.


The workshop will talk about the responsibilities of the various people involved in recital and competition settings: teacher, parents, students, judges, and hosting venue. If time permits, we will watch some videos of performances and do some practice critiquing of the students. This exercise will help prepare both teachers and adjudicators the judging experience.

Dr. Beth A. Bauer received her doctorate of music education from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. Her dissertation is titled "What is an appropriate approach to piano instruction for students with Down syndrome?" Additional degree work includes a Master of Music from Northern Illinois University where she studied with Bill Koehler, and a Bachelor of Arts in Music from the Wheaton College Conservatory of Music where she was a student of Daniel P. Horn. Additional pedagogy instruction occurred with Karin Edwards, Larry Rast, and Karen Taylor. Currently, she is the academic advisor and instructor for the pedagogy degree program at the Wheaton College Conservatory where she also teaches Music to Special Learners and oversees pedagogy student teachers and music internships.

In addition to her faculty work in the Conservatory, Dr. Bauer is the creator of Beethoven's Buddies, a music program for children with developmental delays at the Community School of the Arts, Wheaton College and teaches precollege piano to beginning to advanced students in the Community School of the Arts. Beth has worked in arts administration in the Chicago area and at Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. Her work with students with special needs has been featured in The Chicago Tribune, NBC Nightly News with Brian Williams, the Indiana University Alumni Magazine, The Daily Herald, Clavier Companion, and the Wheaton College Alumni Magazine. Dr. Bauer is a sought after clinician and speaker to professional teacher's organizations and parent groups. She has been teaching piano for 25-years and working with students with special needs for 20-years.

From the Editor


