"Key, not Key! Why Does the Language of Music Educators Have to be so Confusing?" Nicole Douglas




Every day, students can hear a word and think of something completely different yet shake their heads up and down to show they understand. But what if they don't? This session will discuss commonly misunderstood music vocabulary, how to recognize when miscommunication has happened, and ways to increase understanding and memory retention. While this session was created from a desire to better teach students who take things literally, these strategies can benefit all learners.
